He was represented in many major exhibitions worldwide, including Musée du Jeu de Paume, Paris, the Spanish Pavilion at the Paris International Exhibition in 1937, the Museum of Fine Arts in Mexico in 1956, which was soon followed by another retrospective at the Tate Gallery in London in 1963.
