This work is accompanied by a letter confirming the authenticity of the work by Dr. Joachim Pissarro and will be included in the forthcoming Catalogue Raisonné of Drawings by Camille Pissarro.

Pissarro stayed in Venezuela with his friend the Danish painter Fritz Melbye, from November of 1852 to August of 1854. *Bateaux sur la côte,* likely depicts the Venezuelan port of La Guaira. When they arrived in Venezuela, Melbye and Pissarro disembarked the French ship Caraqueña at the port of La Guaira, where they lodged in a boarding-house. La Guaira gave Pissarro his first sense of the kind of topography he would encounter on his trip to Venezuela, and he executed many drawings of the port and of the buildings in town.
