This work is one of the key paintings from Ludovic-Rodo's London period (1915-1922), and it captures the essence of his style during this important phase of his career.

Ludovic Rodo Pissarro depicts here the Royal Exchange building at the junction of Threadneedle Street and Cornhill in the heart of London. Plans began alrealy in 1565 and Queen Elizabeth I granted it royal status in 1570. Fires destroyed the first and second Exchanges, the third and present

building of classical design with a massive portico and eight Corinthian columns was designed by Sir William Tite and opened by Queen Victoria in 1844. The Exchange ceased its original function in 1939.
